

NSA Members in ARC

Misto on the World ARC - leg 1



Our crew for the journey from St Lucia to the Galapagos is now complete as Chuck and Sharon arrived on board on January 4 in time for the Marina Manager's party at Rodney Bay marina. Excitement is mounting as we work to complete our last minute jobs and provision before checking out of St Lucia. Shopping in the Caribbean is always an interesting experience with many fruits and vegetables never seen in US stores. However, the challenge is that many items are often not readily or consistently available and a good maxim is "If you see it, buy it", as when you next shop it may not still be there!

Saturday January 7 is the planned departure from St Lucia to Santa Marta Columbia. The 815 nm is expected to take us 4.5-5 days - it will be downwind in the 20 knot easterly trades until close to Santa Marta where the winds tend to veer to the north east and increase in velocity. On January 18 we will pick up the journey again by going to Panama and the beautiful San Blas Islands.

One of the highlights of this part of the World ARC has to be the Panama Canal transit and we are scheduled to begin our transit on February 1. Once in the Pacific we cruise the Las Perlas Islands before making the passage to the Galapagos, arriving in mid February.

We wish everyone in the NSA wonderful sailing for 2017.
